



SIMPLE, BUT CLASSIC DESIGN,

is an excellent balance of economy, functionality and style. This shed will still be serving you well and looking good when the next generation moves onto the home place. This plan showcases a popular layout with 2/3 cold storage and 1/3 heated shop, both accessed from the front. Having just two (large) doors keeps costs down and makes this layout work especially well when you need to place your building between existing structures.





TAKE YOUR SEED DEALERSHIP TO THE NEXT LEVEL







PUTS ITS BEST FACE FORWARD

This is a serious farm building, but viewed from the house and the road, it presents a more classy—almost residential—look. Your wife will approve. That's largely due to the modestly sized overhead doors with mitered corners, the extra line of trim and cupolas. But make no mistake, even though it will hold lots of "big boy toys" in the heated shop, the shed end holds volumes of big farm machinery, thanks to a 36' split slider on the (less visible) end.









Double Duty





IF FARMING ISN'T YOUR ONLY BUSINESS,

consider accommodating both with one building. This layout is designed for a farmer who also has a thriving crop insurance business - but you could configure the office portion to work for a wide variety of uses. Whatever your sideline, you and your family will appreciate the wraparound porch with cedar posts. It really sets off the office space. The cold storage portion is excellent secondary storage for large farmers, or as the primary storage area for smaller operators.


THIS SHOP WILL MAKE YOU A DEDICATED ADMIRER







SHOP MEETS GARAGE MEETS SHED

Often farm buildings get used for multiple things. And when you've got all that clear-span flexible space, why not? Every guy deserves a warm place to park his pickup and store his tools now that his wife and kids have taken over the house garage. Thus, the small overhead door. Next to it, a large overhead door provides entrance to the business side of the shop. In back, a moderate size tool shed provides storage for farm equipment.














WHERE THE BIG DECISIONS ARE MADE







SERIOUS ABOUT 4-H?





PUT THIS NEXT TO YOUR NEW HOUSE





WHEN YOU WANT TO GET AWAY - BUT STILL STAY CLOSE






COMMERCIAL, MEET AGRICULTURAL


BASIC, BUT ATTRACTIVE STORAGE



Proper placement and sizing of doors, walk door, windows and cupolas makes this feel just right — something you and your neighbors will appreciate. 



FOR THE FARMER WITH A SEED SIDELINE.




TWO STORIES OF PURE PRODUCTIVITY

If you need a serious shop plus some additional equipment storage, take a look at this plan. You get $80' \times 80'$ of unfettered space to work on all your equipment in year-round insulated comfort. That area is so large, there is plenty of room to incorporate a spacious farm office and work bench area with a deck above. The deck level is full height and includes windows, so it could be used for much more than parts storage. Perhaps a play room for the kids/grandkids? An apartment for the hired hand? The sky is the limit.





THE CENTER OF IT ALL





BIG DOORS BID WARM WELCOME TO OVERSIZED EQUIPMENT

Been eyeing the biggest, baddest combine your favorite manufacturer sells? Go ahead! You can even put on the extra big tires and grain extensions. This building can handle it, thanks to the Hydro-Swing® door. It's 40' of full-clearance, wide-open easy access to the roomy shop. Two good-sized overhead doors provide additional access. This building also features a lean-to portion with a stepped down ceiling. Some farmers prefer this because the lower ceiling is cozier and makes it easier to heat.









Load 'em Up





LINED UP AND READY FOR ACTION







AN INDISPENSABLE PART OF THE OPERATION

Plowman Place




MORE THAN JUST A STANDALONE SHOP,
